Foreign Language - Demonstrate the ability to comprehend the topic and main ideas in written

and, with the exception of Latin and Ancient Greek, spoken texts on familiar subjects. Proficiency is demonstrated by passing the FL test with a score of "2" or higher, or by taking 109/110 in GERM LATN, SPAN, or FREN, or by taking 121 in one of the other languages offered.

Higher number courses may also be acceptable. Honors students are encouraged to take SCCC courses that are cross-listed with appropriate Liberal Arts courses. Other SCCC courses may also be acceptable and are evaluated on a case-by-case basis.
