- A longer programming assignment

Homework Redo

- Allows points to be earned back on a previous assignment.
 - Homework
 - Lab Solution and Lab Report
- If you do not get the solution at first, then keep working on it!
- These occur twice each semester
 - Near the Midterm
 - Close to the Last Day of Class
- Make sure to include the text document detailing which assignment is being made up.

Make-up Work

- Make-up work for assignments can be requested **before the assignment is due.**
- Only a small fraction of assignments can be made up for any excuse(s), which is limited to exactly
 - **1 Homework**
 - **1 Lab Solution**
 - **1 Lab Report.**
- Outstanding make-up work must be completed and submitted before any additional make-up work can be issued.

Regrade Requests

- Must be sent directly to the instructor.
